Reminders

• Gate opening & closing times:

This week...

In maths, we have measured the length and height of objects by direct comparison and discussed the need for a more accurate way to measure using non-standard units, such as cubes. In Forest School, we collected sticks and leaves and placed them in order of length to find the longest/shortest item. We used the language of comparison, e.g. long, longer, longest; short, shorter, shortest; tall, taller, tallest. We have carefully counted sets of objects and practised formation of numbers 1-10 (Please see Number formation cards on Seesaw to support practise at home). In Welsh, we have been learning to recognise the colours and expressed our likes and dislikes, using the phrases: 'Dw i'n hoffi...!'/ 'Dw i ddim yn hoffi... '. We played team games such as 'Sblat!' and read stories to help reinforce the new vocabulary. We collected class data on our favourite colours by asking our friends, 'Pa liw wyt ti'n hoffi?' (Which colour do you like?) and used the information to create a block graph. We also continued practising the correct formation of the letters m, a, s, t, d, p, i and n. In Dance we were thinking about Autumn weather and how the wind helps to move and transport. We had to imagine ourselves as a stunt kite making quick, sudden turns and spins and then enact the spiralling helicopter action of sycamore seeds and the light, floating movements of dandelion seeds before putting the movements together in a sequence of contrasting steps and actions. It's been yet another busy week and we'd like to wish you all a safe and happy half term break!
