#### **Governors' Annual Report to Parents**

#### 5. Budget/Financial Statement

The out-turn statement for the school for the year April 2021 to March 2022 can be found in Appendix A at the end of this Report.

The governors noted the formula allocation to the school and were involved in drawing up a proposed budget for the coming year along with the Headteacher, School Business Manager and School Finance Support officer from the Local Authority (LA).

The Personnel and Finance Sub Committee of the Governing Body meet at least once every term in order to monitor the school's budget and make recommendations to the full Governing Body for spending and allocating funds. Governors approved the purchase of the various service level agreements from the LA and outside bodies.

#### 6. Information for Parents/Carers and the School Prospectus

We seek to keep parents and the community informed of the school's activities. Parents receive a Newsflash once a week which provides relevant information, including: important dates, details of special events, trips and visits. In addition, weekly class news is shared via a Home Learning letter.

We also communicate with many of our parents by email. If you are not receiving information in this way, please provide us with your email address as soon as possible and give consent for us to contact you with school news via email.

The website <u>www.ysgolyddraig.co.uk</u> is also a useful tool for communicating information about the school.

In addition to this Annual Report, there is a School Prospectus full of useful information which is updated every year and is available to all new or prospective parents considering sending their child to Ysgol y Ddraig, and to existing parents who request it. The Prospectus is also available to view on our school website.

#### 7. Estyn Inspection

#### 8. <u>Curriculum Statement</u>

The purposes of learning and the new Curriculum for Wales are to create:

- 1. Ambitious, capable learners.
- 2. Healthy, confident individuals.
- 3. Ethical informed citizens.
- 4. Enterprising and creative contributors.

Learning experiences at Ysgol y Ddraig are planned to ensure that children can 'Achieve, Challenge, Enjoy' and aim to ensure children reach their full potential.

We keep abreast of all National Curriculum reform and developments, implementing any change as appropriate for our children and the school.

All children are taught a wide range of skills, knowledge and understanding through areas of learning and subjects delivered in a cross-curricular way through topics.

Termly progress reporting to parents and carers continued this academic year. The reports aim to further include and improve dialogue between learners, teachers and their parents.

Staff have focussed reading and research to the 'Cultures of Learning' which will inform policy and practice in further developing our Ysgol y Ddraig approach alongside Curriculum delivery and design.

Ysgol y Ddraig staff continued to develop pedagogical approaches to support all learners in line with Curriculum Reform throughout the academic year.

The school published its ACE (Achieve, Challenge, Enjoy) curriculum on the school website in July 2022.

#### 9. The Welsh Language & Cynefin

Welsh is taught throughout the school providing progression for children developing Welsh as a Second Language. The scheme of work for Welsh is structured to allow children to speak Welsh as much as possible to reinforce the idea that Welsh is a living language. Welsh is also taught as part of school life on an incidental basis, in the format of greetings and instructions etc.

We actively promote an awareness and pride in our Welsh culture and our heritage in order to establish a genuine sense of Cynefin, through our curriculum and community experiences.

Welsh is taught within lessons, through daily snappy Welsh sessions and through incidental use. The Welsh language is promoted and taught in the school in line with Welsh Government requirements, we are lucky enough to have some members of staff who are fluent in Welsh. Staff who wish to further improve their Welsh fluency are actively encouraged and supported by the governors to do so. 97.3% of children are first language English/Welsh and 2.7% of children are other European first language.

#### 10. <u>Policies</u>

All school management policies are reviewed regularly by staff and governors. Children (through the Senedd or other pupil action groups) and parents are consulted where appropriate. Review dates are recorded in the policies. Changes are brought to the full Governing Body for information and agreement. All policies are available for parents to view on request.

#### 11. School Improvement Plan

Parents/Carers and children in Year 3 to Year 6 were asked to complete questionnaires in the Summer Term. We continue to involve all stakeholders in the self-evaluation process. Teachers who are Area of Learning and Experience (AoLE) Leaders consult learners, link governors and parents and colleagues before drafting a curriculum review and plan for priorities for the development for the year.

The School Improvement Plan is available to view via the school website.

The three year School Improvement Plan focusing on 2021/22 contained action plans for:

- High-quality professionals including Curriculum Reform
- Equity and wellbeing
- Inspirational leaders

Every term the Headteacher provides all governors with a detailed analysis of steps taken, progress made and the way forward.

#### 12. Community Links

We have strong links with the community. Prior to Covid-19 we were involved in visits to the local churches and library. Use of the local environment in projects are an important part of the curriculum. Visits by members of the local community are regular aspects of school life. These were maintained online during the academic year.

The school provides work experience for pupils from nearby comprehensive schools and colleges. Ysgol y Ddraig has formed an alliance with Cardiff Metropolitan University and contributes to Initial Teacher Education by providing placements for student teachers.

#### 13. Support for Charities

The children, parents, staff and governors of the school enjoy supporting a range of charities every year in a variety of ways. It is an important part of the pupils' development in citizenship and, wherever possible, pupils are involved in the organisation of the event.

#### 14. Extra-Curricular Activities

Our Year 6 leavers were able to enjoy an end of year trip to the Supajump and a residential trip to Llangrannog in February.

Our Year 4 and 5 classes visited Manor Adventure for 3 days, for many this was their first experience of a residential trip.

#### 15. Healthy School & Sporting Achievements

Ysgol y Ddraig is a Healthy School and holds the National Quality Award as part of the Welsh Network of Healthy Schools Schemes.

Big Fresh are the providers of school meals. Drinking water is provided throughout the school day. Children are able to bring to school pieces of fruit as healthy snacks.

During the summer term, Years 4, 5 and 6 participated in a programme of swimming lessons at Llantwit Major Leisure Centre.

Inter-schools tournaments resumed on a limited offer during the Summer term.

#### 16. Learner Achievements

#### 17. Additional Learning Needs

The Welsh Government has passed new legislation, called the Additional Learning Needs and Education Tribunal (Wales) Act, and Additional Learning Needs (ALN) Code, which will replace all of the legislation and guidance about special educational needs. As part of the Act the Welsh Government has replaced the term 'special educational needs' (SEN) with 'additional learning needs' (ALN).

ALN will cover those who:

- have a significantly greater difficulty in learning than the majority of others of the same age
- have a disability which prevents or hinders them from making use of the educational facilities generally provided for others of the same age in mainstream maintained school or Further Education Institution.

There are four main areas of ALN:

- Cognition and Learning
- Sensory and Physical
- Communication Interaction
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health

Miss Bale is the Additional Learning Needs Co-ordinator (ALNCo) and Mr John Durrant is the Governor Representative for Additional Learning Needs.

All children are provided with learning that is appropriate to their stage and ability. Children are identified for Additional Needs support by a variety of independent and on-going teacher assessment. If necessary, and in consultation with parents, children are included on an Additional Learning Needs Register to track their progress. This is updated regularly and is audited. Where possible and appropriate, children are supported by their class teachers and learning support assistants within the classroom as this provides the most effective support. There are specific interventions, where children are supported on a one to one or small group basis. Regular contact is maintained with other schools and agencies through regular meetings attended by the ALNCO.

The school procedures are constantly reviewed in line with the ALN Code of Practice, working with outside agencies such as the educational psychologist, behaviour support staff, specialist teachers and other external agencies when required. Parents are always part of any decision making to involve outside bodies and are kept informed of progress and changes.

#### 18. <u>Toilets</u>

There are adequate numbers of toilets including access to disabled toilets in our school. The toilets are monitored through the school day by staff and cleaned daily to a high standard by our cleaning team.
