This week...

We have continued to learn more about Diwali, the Hindu 'Festival of Lights'. To help us understand the important parts of the celebration we made and decorated pinch pot diya lamps form salt dough and uploaded a photo onto Seesaw; designed mehndi patterns; constructed symmetrical rangoli floor patterns using Numicon, 2-D shapes and loose parts; made a Diwali greetings card by following step-by-step instructions; tasted a poppadom and mango chutney; listened to traditional Indian music; created a firework picture; and finally, used information from our own mind map of Diwali to write a description of the five day festival using a word mat and 'Fred Fingers' to help us spell some of the topic words. PHEW! We also followed the Diwali theme in our Dance lesson by acting out parts of the story through movement and response to music. We completed practising the 'Robot-arm' letters (p, b, k) and thought carefully about the formation and size. [Please, take a look at the letter formation 'How to' videos on Seesaw to help extra practise at home.] We had a great time in Forest School finding out about how to build shelters from natural materials for different animals. We had to learn how to tie knots and worked in pairs to build tripod shelters. We talked about camouflage and how to disguise the shelters from predators. Something that we'd all been looking forward to this week was writing our letters to Father Christmas! We looked at the structure of a letter and used a writing frame with different sentence openers to help us organise our writing. Some of us tried to use connectives and more detail to extend our sentences. We also had to write Father Christmas' address on the envelope, being very careful to write our words clearly for the postman to read. Some of us knew our own address and we talked about why it's important to know where we live. We are going to walk to Llantwit Major Post Office to post our letters very soon. If you have not already done so, please remember to send a first class postage stamp into school before Wednesday 25th November - Thank you!
