<p>Read the school reading book and ask a grown up to comment in your reading record.</p>	<p>Create a collage of a seaside scene using magazine pages.</p>	<p>Look at a map of Wales, you could use an online map or a map you have at home. Can you find different beaches around Wales? Make a list of the beaches and state if they are in North, South, West or Mid Wales?</p>	<p>Learn double facts- double all numbers up to 10 For example $1+1=2$ $2+2=4$... $6+6=12$, $7+7=14$...$9+9=18$ $10+10=20$</p> <p>Practise my number facts by completing challenges on ActiveLearn.</p>
<p>Make a 3-D sea animal. You could use any material you like - perhaps papier-mâché, fabric, plastic bottles, clay, play dough or Lego pieces?</p>	<p>Visit your local library to browse or borrow story and information books about the seaside. Write or film a book review about your favourite.</p>	<p>Visit a local beach and create beach/sand art using shells, twigs, pebbles, sand and any other objects you find on the beach. Take a photograph to share with your friends in school.</p>	<p>With an adult, use the web to research famous artists who use the beach for inspiration. Can you create your own beach art in the style of a famous artist?</p>
<p>Learn number bonds of 10/20 - pairs of numbers that make 10/20. For example $0+1$, $1+9$, $2+8$, $3+7$,.....</p>	<p>Make a word search with all the names of the living creatures found on a beach. Ask your family and friends to have a go!</p>	<p>Design your own treasure map, using an X to mark the hidden treasure. Can you write directions using mathematical language (4 steps forward, over the bridge etc.)</p>	<p>Practise reading the HFW wall at speed and also learn how to spell these tricky words.</p>
