This week we have been working hard on our mark-making and making our hands strong for writing. Our activities included our "dough disco" and some "squiggle while you wiggle" activities which are movements to music that help co-ordination and gross and fine motor control.

We enjoyed sharing the story of "Frisky Five", a very excitable kangaroo. We went on a conker hunt outside and practised counting the conkers that we found with 1:1 correspondence.


We have listened to lots of stories about pumpkins and found out about the life cycle of the pumpkin. We investigated whether a large pumpkin was waterproof and tested to see if it would float or sink in the water tray. We scooped out a pumpkin to see what was inside and we counted out our pumpkin seeds and hammered golf tees into the pumpkin with little hammers. A pumpkin house appeared in our small world area this week and this invited lots of imaginative story making with the fairy characters.

During our PE lesson we focused on learning the Body School Action of "frog hopping" and used this way of travelling to move around a circuit. We also practised our aim by throwing quoits and tried to score some points too!
