<p>Read the school reading book and ask a grown up to comment in your reading record.</p>	<p>Can you draw an aerial plan (bird's eye view) of your own bedroom including a key?</p>	<p>Interview someone who has lived in your community for a long time, perhaps an elderly relative or neighbour you know well. What changes have they seen? Which things are better or worse today? Type up a report of your interview on Hwb.</p>	<p>Learn to add/subtract 10, 20 and 30 to any 2-digit number. Can you record the number sentences too.</p> <p>E.g. $43 + 10 = 53$ $43 + 20 = 63$</p>
<p>Can you draw a map of your route to school, including key features that you pass on your journey?</p>	<p>Make a leaflet, poster or short film all about your local community. Include drawings, photographs or footage to show what you can see and do in your local area. Write or record your thoughts on what it is like to live there as well as ideas for improving it.</p>	<p>Draw and label a design for your own fantasy home. What will your home be built from? How will you get in and out of your house? What will you have in your garden? Make a model of your fantasy house using recyclable materials.</p>	<p>Can you write directions from your house to a local feature (shop, church, leisure centre, park) using directional language, e.g turn right. You may also want to use time connectives such as first, next, then, after, and finally.</p>
<p>Log on to Active Learn and Mathletics to practise your number skills through interactive games.</p>	<p>Look in detail at the outside of your house and make a careful observational drawing.</p>	<p>Visit a local shop with your grown up. Write a shopping list before you go. Pay for your shopping and work out your change. Take photos to share with your friends in school. You may want to type up your shopping list on Hwb.</p>	<p>Practise reading the HFW wall at speed and also learn how to spell these tricky words.</p>
