In Dosbarth Colhuw we started our week off by reading a book called '10 things I can do to help my world'. We then used this book to help us create a 'caring tree'. We chose 3 ideas from the book and wrote them onto hearts and placed them around a handprint tree trunk in our learning journals.

On Monday and Tuesday this week, we had a go at planting some seeds. We watched lots of videos on how to care for our seeds and we've made sure they are getting lots of sunlight and water. And some of them have started to grow already!

We also had a go practicing our scissors skills this week. Inside, we used scissors to chop up some lettuce and outside, we used scissors to cut up some spaghetti. We also used our scissors skills to create a sun to help our plants grow.

In Forest School this week, we were learning all about bees. We made bumblebee crowns and worked together to collect nectar with pipettes and place it into our honeycomb. We also used herbs to create 'smell pots' and sprinkled herbs around for the Forest School fairies to enjoy. We also used magnifying glasses to see if we could spot any minibeast and had a go at sawing some bamboo for our Forest School bug hotel.
